Well written, typed essay addressing applicant criteria above. This essay should be 500 minimum to 750 words maximum.
Two typed letters of reference from two separate people, mentor or friend, who know you well, detailing why you deserve consideration for this scholarship. Each letter should be at least 250 words.
Letter of acceptance or proof of enrollment in college or in post high school technical/trade school.
